

Acupuncture Course Fees 2018/ 2019

Registration Fee: £150

One-off fee required before starting any course throughout the duration of your studies.

The fees shown below cover tuition and examinations. The College accepts remittances in the form of Bankers Draft, International Money Orders or Postal Orders (made payable to Inter-Ed UK Ltd., and crossed Account Payee Only), or by most major credit cards.

We suggest that students should also set aside in the region of £500 to cover text books across the three years of the course. We will advise you which books will be the best to purchase as they will need to be useful to you even after graduation. The college library contains many other books on the subjects we teach.

When you start to work in the clinic in the third year we will need to purchase a starter kit containing the basic equipment you will need as a practitioner. We will give you a list what you require and you may buy these items individually or approach a supplier to see if you can arrange a student discount. The starter kit will cost in the region of £150.

Professional and Career Development Loans

We are registered as a **Learning Provider** with the SFA (Skills Funding Agency) for **Professional and Career Development Loans** (PCDL Registration Number: 21461), which means that you have the option of applying for a **Career Development Loan** (PCDL). <https://www.gov.uk/career-development-loans/overview>.

- The training period for which the Skills Funding Agency allows is limited to a maximum of 24 months
- These loans generally have a lower interest rate, and the main benefit is that the government pays the interest for you while you are training, and repayments only commence once your studies have been completed
